<b>FACTS</b>	<b>What does HAB BANK (HABIB AMERICAN BANK/ THE BANK) do with your personal information?</b>
<b>Why?</b>	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.
<b>What?</b>	<p>The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Social Security number</li> <li>• Transaction history</li> <li>• Assets</li> <li>• Employment information</li> <li>• Account transactions</li> <li>• Credit history</li> </ul> <p>When you are <i>no longer</i> our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.</p>
<b>How?</b>	All financial companies need to share customers' person information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons HAB BANK chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

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## What We Do?

<b>How does HAB Bank protect my personal information?</b>	To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.
<b>How does HAB Bank collect my personal information?</b>	We collect your personal information, for example, when you: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• open an account or make a deposit</li><li>• pay your bills or apply for a loan</li><li>• use your debit cards</li></ul> We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates or other companies
<b>Why can't I limit all sharing?</b>	Federal law gives you the right to limit only: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes - information about your creditworthiness</li><li>• affiliates from using your information to market to you</li><li>• sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you</li></ul> State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.

## Definitions

<b>Affiliates</b>	Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• HAB BANK does not share information with affiliates.</li></ul>
<b>Nonaffiliates</b>	Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• HAB BANK does not share information with nonaffiliates.</li></ul>
<b>Joint Marketing</b>	A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you. <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• HAB BANK doesn't jointly market.</li></ul>
